(Romans 12:13) We make it our goal here at the Greater St. John Food Pantry to provide a warm atmosphere where each person who visits feels safe and welcome. We hope that every person who visits our food pantry leaves with the food they need and the dignity they deserve.

Our Food Pantry is located in the multi-purpose building next door to the sanctuary. This pantry is church sponsored and run solely by volunteer workers. The success of our food pantry has been the result of many hours of hard work and prayer. The volunteers strive to make the Greater St. John Food Pantry the best that it can be, serving this area for the glory of God. Currently we require clients to maintain the recommended social distance by walking-up to the building door and get their food. Our volunteers wear facemasks and gloves for every ones safety. The Food Pantry servers people every Wednesday from 10:00 am to 11:15 am.

Last year our Food pantry served 350 households and over 560 individuals. Our Food Pantry provides food and a variety of products for families to use in their homes. We believe no one should go hungry. Whether you're homeless, unemployed, a parent with children, veteran, senior adult, or just going through a challenging time in life, we do not turn anyone away.







BLACK HISTORY MOMENT



ELLA BAKER

She risked her life to rally activists in the Deep South

She played a major role in three of the biggest groups of the civil rights movement, but Ella Baker somehow still remains largely unknown outside activist circles.

Baker grew up in North Carolina, where her grandmother's stories about life under slavery inspired her passion for social justice.


As an adult, she became an organizer within the NAACP and helped co-found the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, the organization that the Rev. Martin Luther King Jr. led. She also helped found the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC).

For her efforts, Baker has been called the "Mother of the civil rights movement."
