



SOUTH BEND LAUNCHES NEW WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM TO OFFER TRAININGS AND CERTIFICATIONS TO RESIDENTS

The Department of Community Investment announced today the launch of Upskill SB, a new workforce development program targeting job seekers, professionals, and recent high school or college graduates to earn industry-level job certifications. By offering a wide range of training options and reimbursing certification costs, Upskill SB aims to develop highly skilled workers in South Bend and retain high quality jobs in the region.

The program will accept 10-15 South Bend residents and assist in identifying training and certifications that best fit each participant's career interests. Through Upskill SB, the City will reimburse 100% of exam costs and at least 50% of training costs, with additional financial aid qualifying participants. Those who do not have a computer or internet may also be eligible for technology reimbursements.

Participants must hold a high school diploma or equivalent and must be a resident of South Bend. Residents can apply to the program and find more information at <u>southbendin.gov/upskillSB</u>. The application will remain open until the cohort is full or until June 3.

REJOICING 35 YEARS OF SERVICE

he Greater St. John Missionary Baptist Church "Stepping For Christ" Drill Team will be celebrating their 35th anniversary of service. The Drill Team was organized in 1987 under the pastor ship of the late Rev. Dr. William W. Kirk. The church Sunday School Department, under the leadership of the late General Superintendent Brother Aaron Wright, attended the 1987 National Sunday School Baptist Training Union Congress in Dallas, Texas. Attending the National Sunday School BTU Congress included Sisters Allene McMorris, Lorraine Munlin, and Pinkie Works. Michael Munlin also attended and just loved the BTU Congress and was so excited with the drill team he saw and their participation at the BTU Congress that he asked Sisters McMorris and Works to please start a drill team so he could be in it.

His request was presented to Rev. Kirk, who answered in the negative, but suggested that the request be presented to the Church Body and the church voted yes! Sisters McMorris, Munlin and Works organized the Greater St. John Drill Team. Michael Munlin, Keyon Laws, Latonya Wilder Dotson and Jamal Keys were among the first members.

Sister Jacqueline Keys was the first Director and Sister Sylvia Martin was the first Assistant Director. The Late Deacon James Sims was the first Matron Dean of the team and Sister Velma Harris was Publisher.

The Drill Team was placed under the Educational Division of the church, which is the Sunday School Department. In 1993, the name 'Stepping for Christ' was added to the Greater St. John Missionary Baptist Church Drill Team. The 'Stepping for Christ Drill Team' consisted of two components: Team "A" and Team "B".

The Drill Team currently minister under the leadership of Pastor Andre' A. McGhee, Director Sister Cheryl Wilder, Choreographer Keemo Richardson, Squad Leaders Sean Paul Finch and Dayonna Marsh, and Matron Lucy Wigfall.

The 'Stepping for Christ Drill Team' has been active in our own church as well as in the community and nationally. They have performed at many local churches and have performed statewide (in Indiana) in Elkhart, Kingsford Heights, Michigan City, Fort Wayne and Indianapolis. Out of state - Benton Harbor and Detroit Michigan, St. Louis, Missouri, Nashville, Tennessee, Louisville, Kentucky, Houston, Texas and Phoenix, Arizona, Orlando, Florida, Atlanta and Memphis.

They have won first place in their categories in 1999, 2002 and 2003 at the National Sunday School and Baptist Training Union Congress. They have ministered at the Northwestern Sunday School and Baptist Training Union Indiana District from 1991-1993. They most recently ministered at the Nationals in 2015 and 2018.
