# **GREATER ST. JOHN HISTORY**

In1972 the "Live Wire Club" of Saint John Missionary Baptist Church celebrated their 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. The Live Wire Club was organized in 1922 by Mrs. M. Davidson the first Pastor's wife. The club was organized to raise money for the Building Fund. Later years they expanded their responsibilities to raising money for church repairs, furniture and care for needy families throughout our community

The first club committee had the following members: Mrs. Mary Brown, Mrs. Jessie Chavis, Mrs. Helen Sanders and Mrs. Myrtel Sharp, they met at 1601 Liston St., South Bend. The first benefit dinner was served October 1922 and made a profit of \$52.00.

To raise money the Live Wire Club held benefit dinners, bazaars, where fine needle work, gingham sun bonnets and pastries were made and sold for the benefit of the church. Pageants, skating parties for the youth, lawn socials, smorgasbords, candy sales and personal pledges were the means of income at various times.


The club also presented many plays, directed by Mrs. Sanders, such as "We Turned from Christ", "Dust of the Earth", and "Prodigal Son."

Under various leaders, money was raised to pay for lumber, furnace repairs and purchase our first bulletin board. The club raised money to help purchase new pews, instituted a Thanksgiving Dinner for needy families in the community and bought Christmas gifts for mentally challenged patients. 
# BLESSED GOSPEL MAGAZINE BLACK HISTORY MONTH PROGRAM
